

Green & Co Accountants and Tax Advisors take a look at the fundamental changes that have come in since the turn of the year:

Brexit - The end of the Brexit transition period on 31 December 2020 ushered in a range of new trade rules and regulations applicable to businesses that trade with the EU. Firms need to follow new rules on exports, imports, tariffs, data and hiring. VAT changes include - import VAT due on all goods, and accounting for the VAT has been postponed until 1 July 2021. Consignments of less than £135 should have UK supply VAT applied at the point of sale rather than UK import VAT. The Low-Value Consignment Relief (LVCR) has been abolished, and exports to the EU are zero-rated for VAT.

Recovery Loan Scheme - Budget 2021 announced a successor loan scheme to aid post-COVID-19 business recovery. The Recovery Loan Scheme opened on 6 April 2021 and will run until 31 December 2021, providing ongoing support to UK businesses. Loans are available through a network of accredited lenders listed on the British Business Bank's website. You need to show that your business would be viable were it not for the pandemic, has been adversely impacted by the pandemic and is not in collective insolvency proceedings. Up to £10 million is available per business with lenders covered by an 80% government guarantee. You will not be expected to sign a personal guarantee on facilities up to £250,000, and a borrower's principal private residence cannot be taken as security.

COVID-19 support schemes - As was widely anticipated, the main COVID-19 business support schemes, the Coronavirus Job Retention Scheme (CJRS) and the Self-Employment Income Support Scheme (SEISS), were extended in the Budget to 30 September 2021. Eligibility conditions for phases four and five of the SEISS grants have changed considerably, so we would advise you to check the eligibility criteria. Those who missed out on the first three grants may now be eligible. The grants are subject to tax, and you should include them in your income for the year.

Super-deduction-A key headline from Budget 2021 was a new 'super-deduction' for limited companies to boost investment. Companies investing in qualifying new plant and machinery assets from 1 April 2021 until 31 March 2023 will be able to claim a 130% super-deduction capital allowance and a 50% first-year allowance for qualifying special rate assets. The super-deduction will allow companies to cut their tax bill by up to 25p for every £1 they invest.

PEOPLE IN WALES WHO CANNOT WORK FROM HOME ENCOURAGED TO USE LATERAL FLOW SELF-TESTS

All those who cannot work from home are being encouraged to access lateral flow self-test kits as they are rolled out across Wales.

The rapid coronavirus testing kits will be available to collect from local test sites across Wales - your local site is Pontypool, Old Mill Car Park from 8am to 1pm daily.

The Welsh Government is also looking at other collection venues for test kits to be made available, as well as being directly delivered to people's homes. It is hoped that improving the availability of lateral flow tests will make regular asymptomatic testing for

coronavirus more convenient and accessible for people not covered under existing schemes at workplaces, childcare settings, schools, colleges and universities. http://bit.ly/full-details-here





The owner of an office design business in Torfaen has launched a new make-up range catering to men called BUG for Men. Cwmbran-based Cargo Interiors Limited secured a £50,000 micro loan from the Development Bank of Wales to support the cosmetics launch. Founded in 2019 by Managing Director Carl Gough, the office design and build company decided to launch a new strand for their business following the Covid 19 pandemic.

Carl said: "It became clear during the first lockdown of 2020 that the way we work was going to fundamentally change. I looked into gaps in the market where I could use my existing skills and decided to launch our BUG for Men cosmetics brand."

BUG for Men operates alongside his existing office design and build business, which has seen a recent

TORFAEN'S TEST TRACE & PROTECT (TTP)



Since Summer last year, Torfaen County Borough Council's Test Trace and Protect (TTP) Team has been hard at work, contacting thousands of cases and their contacts, breaking chains of Covid transmission to deliver the Welsh Government's highly effective second pillar of Wales' response to the Covid outbreak and playing their part in keeping the levels of Covid infection under control in Torfaen and Wales in general.

The service, built totally from scratch, as the cases increased and the pandemic worsened last year, is part of a ground-breaking partnership between the five local authorities of Gwent and Aneurin Bevan University Health Board, backed up by expertise from Environmental Health professionals and Public Health Wales. It really has been a 'Team Wales' success thanks to local and national teams working hand in glove to deliver a 98% success rate of people that have been traced as confirmed positive cases of COVID-19 across Gwent.

The team are part remote working and part office based and are a combination of existing council staff seconded from their roles all across the organisation and local individuals recruited to fill the many new roles that were created, as the team expanded to deal with the rising volumes of cases, including a brand new 'Covid Enforcement Team', created alongside TTP to provide 'on the ground' support to the team and to local businesses across the borough.

Most recently, the team have supported the wider Public Protection Team, in rolling out an extensive food premises study, contacting every food premises across the borough, as part of the preparation for the re-opening of the industry.

In addition, a series of information sessions have been delivered to a range of businesses in the area. in partnership with the council's Economy



and Enterprise Team, running alongside the Government's re-opening programme, sector by sector, as Covid rules are relaxed. These sessions are intended to provide information on the functions of the TTP operation, how businesses can work with TTP to keep their staff and customers safe and what lessons can be learnt from the cases and clusters of cases that Torfaen have experienced over the past



Jason Austin, TTP lead for Torfaen said:

"I am very proud of what the team has achieved over the past few months. It has been a total learning experience for all of us and a huge challenge, to create an operation and a team from nothing, with a brand new IT system and to stay on top of huge increases in cases. To be in a position of being one of the top performing TTP teams in Wales, is a testament to the effort and the dedication of each and every member of the team"

TTP will continue at least until September, as the Welsh Government has released funding to continue the work into the Autumn. The team are always happy to help and would welcome contact from any business with queries or questions and urge companies to get in touch through any of the methods below
