However, the single most effective way to stay safe from the majority of cyber-enabled crime is vigilance.

"Most of the crimes experienced by businesses are opportunistic, phishing exercises that can be identified and avoided if businesses keep up to date with current cyber threats. We have already invested in a specialist Cyber Crime Unit, including a dedicated Cyber Community Support Officer, and Cyber Protect

Officer, to deliver help, advice to businesses in Gwent. I would urge businesses to reach out and access the free support that is available to them."

Cwmbran-based telecoms company RPS Telecom have become a member of Treepoints, a certified Social Enterprise who help businesses understand their emissions, support climate projects and track their impacts.

Becoming a greener business boasts the benefits of happier employees, offsetting business travel, supporting local communities and rewarding your team, according to Treepoints.

Natalie Strange, General Manager of RPS Telecom said: "With climate change an ever-increasing threat, there has been a push for businesses to take action, and we are doing just that. We will be offsetting a total of 42 tonnes of carbon each year, planting 840 trees and recycling 840 bottles.

"For many businesses, the move to remote working has led to a decline in their environmental impact. 95% of RPS Telecom's customers are supported remotely, up 15% from last year. When in-person visits are made, team members car-share which also has the benefit of boosting morale."

Becoming a member of Treepoints has allowed the team to understand their emissions. RPS Telecom's office is fitted with environmentally friendly automatic lights, the company encourages a paperless policy and all packaging is recycled.





PONTYPOOL STEEL SPECIALISTS GAINS CRUCIAL FUNDING FOR INVESTMENT

Pro Steel engineering has successfully secured grant funding from Welsh Government's Productivity Enhancement Programme for crucial investment. The programme was launched in Torfaen in 2020 by the Economy & Enterprise Team at Torfaen Council in partnership with Welsh Government and has seen a significant amount of capital investment awarded to Torfaen's manufacturing sector.

Pontypool steel specialist company Pro Steel Engineering has put the grant funding of £25,000 to good use by purchasing new cranes. The investment will allow double lifting capacity in one bay of the factory, and considerable support in another bay. Crucially and of significant benefit, is the ability to now utilise additional cranes at the same time as the existing crane, which will increase productivity and significantly reduce the time that staff members have historically had to wait for lifting apparatus.



BUSINESS IN THE COMMUNITY: AGE AT WORK

Join the growing group of businesses in Wales that are benefitting from an age diverse and inclusive workplace.

The proportion of people aged 50+ in employment has risen over the last 20 years, with one in three workers now aged 50 or older.

However, this rise has now stalled and people over 50 are leaving work prematurely due to factors including: ageism in recruitment; lack of flexibility from employers; insufficient support for health conditions; and difficulty managing caring responsibilities alongside work.

Business in the Community Cymru (BITC) supports businesses to take action on age inclusion in the workplace through the Age at Work programme, in partnership with Age Cymru and funded by the National Lottery Community Fund.

A key part of this programme is the Age Inclusive Learning Network, which brings together and supports HR, wellbeing and inclusion professionals, from businesses of all sizes and all sectors, to become more age-inclusive in their approach to workplace policy and practice.

The Network meets over five facilitated sessions to share best practice, discuss challenges and opportunities, and to hear from expert speakers. Participants are supported to develop a bespoke Age-Inclusive Action Plan, and to implement this in their business as part of wider Health & Wellbeing and Diversity & Inclusion strategies.
